Mennonite Central Committee's Material Resource Project for January is sewing kits. The following new items may be placed in bags that are used for school kits.

- 1 metric tape measure
- 2 spools dual use white thread (cotton/polyester, min. 300 yards each)
- 2 spools dual use black thread (cotton/polyester, min. 300 yards each)
- 1 medium size thimble
- 1 good quality dressmaker's scissors
- 1 package needles (approximately 25)
- 1 package straight pins (approximately 100)
- 1 package hooks and eyes (approximately 12)
- 1 package sew on snaps (approximately 20-25)
- 10 assorted safety pins

Sewing kits provide basic tools to make and mend clothing, and when linked with training, also generate income by helping others. 365 kits were shipped to Haiti after the earthquake. Small items like sewing supplies often cannot be rescued. Bring filled sewing kits to church, and we will see that they are delivered.
