MEMORIZE – Hebrews 7: 24-25

But Jesus holds his priesthood permanently, because he continues forever. Consequently, he is able to save to the uttermost those who draw near to God through him, since he always lives to make intercession for them

READ Hebrews 10

questions to ponder/discuss:
1. What is this passage revealing about God and what is it revealing about us as humans?
2. If the above is true, what needs to change in your life? What will that look like?
3. What is the primary shortfall of the sacrifices under the old covenant? (hint: v2)
4. What is the importance of Jesus having sat down after offering his sacrifice? (hint: v14)
5. What does Jesus sacrifice do that the old sacrifices never could? (hint: v18)
a. What then does the author encourage us to do in light of this new reality? (hint: v19)
b. What does he warn us not do to? (hint: v26-29)
c. What is the author of Hebrews ultimately calling us to do? (v35-39)

d. What are things that tempt us walk away from our faith? What in your life right now is or is

Experiential

Sometimes activities help us to understand and process biblical truths. The ones below are suggestions for how to experience the truths of Hebrews 10. Feel free to use one of these or any you might come up with.

Living out at Home

Read verses 23-25 again. This is how the author of Hebrews desires us to live in community with one another. Come up with ways as an individual, couple, family or small group to live these out intentionally at home. For example, "let us not neglect meeting together" may be setting apart certain nights where you will have sit down meals together. We want to put these commands into practice, beginning at home and then continuing as we go.
