MEMORIZE – Lamentations 3: 21-23

But this I call to mind, and therefore I have hope: The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness.

READ Lamentations 4

Questions to ponder/discuss:

- 1. What is this passage revealing about God and what is it revealing about us as humans?
- 2. If the above is true, what needs to change in your life? What will that look like?
- 3. Verses 1-10 is the result of "God giving full vent of his wrath" (v11). Compare and contrast this to what Paul tells us in Romans 1: 18-32 about the wrath of God.
- 4. Read verse 20 again.
 - a. Who is the LORD's anointed?
 - b. Why is he called "the breath of our nostrils?"
 - c. What happened to him and why is this a problem for the people?
 - d. How is this verse ultimately fulfilled in Jesus?
- 5. What hope is offered in verse 22 after a completely depressing chapter 4? How does this show God's grace?
