READ Zephaniah 2
Questions to ponder/discuss:
1. What is this passage revealing about God and what is it revealing about us as humans?
2. If the above is true, what needs to change in your life? What will that look like?
 What does Zephaniah say is the only way the people might escape the coming
judgment? (2:1-3) How do you seek God? What gets in the way?
4. What sins had the nations around Judah committed and how would they be punished?
(2:4-15) What hope does Zephaniah offer? (2:7)
5. To those who scoffed and asked why the "Day of the Lord" that the prophets
oretold had not come, Peter offers an answer (2 Peter 3:1-13). What is that answer and how does it illustrate God's mercy, grace, and love? What advice is there for us still waiting
or that final "Day of the Lord" yet today?

EXPERIENTIAL

PRAY

This is a time to gather around for prayer requests and to share how you have seen God at work. It is a time to hear where God is showing up in our lives and where we need Him to help us in our lives.

Sending prayer based on the lesson:

Thank you merciful God that you warn us because you do not want to wound us. Just as a day of judgment was coming for the ancient world, so a day of judgment is coming for our world. In the face of such imminent danger you call us not to scatter and hide but to gather and pray. In your kindness you lead us to repentance.
