

Dig Deeper @Home – "With Everything" Complement to sermon on February 04, 2018 – "Where & When to Worship?"

MEMORIZE – Psalm 145:1-2

I will extol you, my God and King, and bless your name forever and ever. Every day I will bless you and praise your name forever and ever.

READ Psalms 148 and 150

Questions to ponder/discuss:

1. What do these Psalms reveal about who God is and what He does? (Make a list)	
2. What do these Psalms reveal about creation's response to God? (Make a list)	

- 3. The summary of Sunday's sermon is that we are to worship God everywhere, all the time.
 - a. What does this look like practically?
 - b. What about this makes you uncomfortable?
 - c. What area of life could you more proactively worship God in? What makes it hard to worship God in that area? What could you do to change that?
- 4. Psalm 148 verse 14 says that God alone is the be worshipped because "he has raised up a horn for his people."
 - a. What does it mean that He raised up a horn?
 - b. Do you live with a daily dependence on God's horn? Why or why not? What would it take to live with a daily dependence on God's horn in your life?

Summarize the Psalm 148 and Psalm 150 each in two sentences or less

Experiential

Sometimes activities help us to understand and process biblical truths. The one below is a suggestion for how to experience the truths of Psalm 148 and 150. Feel free to use this or any other experience you might come up with.

Worship in all of Life

Each day this week, pick a different medium to offer worship to God. Maybe one day it's by calling someone and sharing what difference Jesus made in your life today, maybe the next day it's on facebook, the next day it's a group text message to family/friends and another day it's by breaking out in a worship song in your yard or while taking a walk. Commit to worship God every day, each day in a different way and live out Psalm 150 which tells us to worship God everywhere.

SING (suggested songs to sing. Use these or any song you might want to sing)

O Praise the Name

This song of worship invites us to give all our worship and all of our praise to God who is worthy of our praise.

O Worship the King - #15 in Mennonite Hymnal

A hymn of worship based on Psalm 104. O worship the King all glorious above and gratefully sing His power and His love.

PRAY

This is a time to gather around for prayer requests and to share how you have seen God at work. A time to hear where God is showing up in our lives and where we need Him to help us in our lives.

Sending prayer based on the lesson:

Father, move powerfully in our lives this week so that no matter where we go or what we are doing, we are led to bring you worship, honor, and glory. In Jesus' name, amen.
