

# Dig Deeper @Home - "Religious Anarchy" Complement to sermon on 2/25/18 - "The Delusion of Doing Right in our own Eyes"

#### MEMORIZE – 1 Samuel 8:6-7

But the thing displeased Samuel when they said, "Give us a king to judge us." And Samuel prayed to the Lord. And the Lord said to Samuel, "Obey the voice of the people in all that they say to you, for they have not rejected you, but they have rejected me from being king over them.

# **READ Judges 10:6 – 12:7**

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Questions to ponder/discuss:
1. What does this passage from Judges reveal about God? About humanity?
2. If the above is true, what needs to change in your life?
3. Compare and contrast the exchange between Jephthah and Ammonite King in Judges 11: 12-28
with Jephthah and the Ephraimites in Judges 12: 1-6.
4. Because of the events recorded in it, Judges is a particularly difficult book to read. What do you think is the point of these stories being recorded? (hint: remember to think about where it fits in
the grand narrative of scripture: Creation, Rebellion, Redemption Recreation).
5. Look again through the passage and identify all the times someone or a group of people turn to
someone else for guidance or help or support. List these out. Who do you see people turning to? Who aren't people turning to? What can we learn from this?

6. The book of Judges seems almost unbelievable with all of the horrible stories that it shares. But are we much different? Talk about current events in the US or around the world. Would the phrase "in those days the US had no king" be applicable. Why or why not?

Summarize the Judges 10:6 – 12:7 in two sentences or less:

### **Experiential**

Sometimes activities help us to understand and process biblical truths. The one below is a suggestion for how to experience the truths of Judges 2. Feel free to use this or any other experience you might come up with.

#### Newsfeed

Go to a news site and read the headlines. If you are with a group, talk about some of these headlines together. How do you feel about this? How do you God feels about this? How is Christ calling us to respond?

### **Testimony Time**

Share a time in your own life when you made a decision in your life that seemed right in your eyes or when you made a rash vow. How did it turn out? What did you learn from it? Where did you see God in it? What does it show about His faithfulness?
