### ICE BREAKER – Questions to open dialogue and learn more about those gathered

# READ – Daniel 9:1-19

#### **Questions to ponder/discuss:**

- 1. What does the Holy Spirit draw your attention to as you read these passages?
  - a. What sticks out to you?
  - b. Is anything repeated? Contrasted? Compared?
  - c. List 3-5 questions you have about the passage you read. Pray that you may receive clarity on what you do not understand and commit to ask a brother or sister in Christ if they might be able to provide clarity on at least one of them in the coming week.
  - d. What is the passage revealing about God? About people? In light of these, what needs to change in your life?
- Here in chapter 9, Daniel prays on behalf of "the men of Judah... the inhabitants of Jerusalem." In the passage from this week's sermon, we saw Daniel praying with his "windows... open toward Jerusalem." (6:10) Why does he do this? (Hint: Take a look at Daniel 1:1-2 and 1 Kings 8:28-30)
- 3. Daniel 9 is a window into Daniel's prayer life. (Pun intended! See Daniel 6:10) What aspects of his prayer might you incorporate into your own prayer life?


# **EXPERIENTIAL ACTIVITY – Praying the Scripture**

In Daniel 9 we see that Daniel's prayer flows from his time spent in the "books" containing "the word of the LORD." We too should let our prayers flow from our study of Scripture!

Consider the passage you just read in Daniel 9. Do you feel the Spirit nudging you to pray for anything specific after reading? Perhaps you feel compelled to offer prayers for a particular nation, personal prayers of repentance, or a prayer of adoration to our "great and awesome" God. Take some time to obey the Spirit's prompting and pray for these things individually or as a group.

Allowing your prayer to be guided by the Bible is a powerful and helpful way of engaging with the Lord.
