## MEMORIZE – Matthew 1:21

She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.

## READ – Matthew 2: 1-12

#### **Questions to ponder/discuss:**

- 1. Re-scan the text and consider...
  - a. Did the Holy Spirit cause anything in particular to "jump off the page" as you read?
  - b. Is anything repeated? Contrasted? Compared? (If so... why might that be?)
  - c. What are the verses revealing about God? About people? In light of these, what needs to change in your life? What are you already doing well?
- 2. Who are these "wise men" seeking Jesus? (Did you know Matthew 2 is the only place in Scripture they are mentioned?) What do we learn about them from these 12 verses? What things might you have believed were true about them that Scripture doesn't ACTUALLY say?
- 3. How did the wise men know where to find the "king of the Jews?" Could Numbers 24:17 and Micah 5:2 be Messianic predictions they were familiar with or heard? (Take a look!)
- 4. A main focus of our Advent sermon series is how people respond to Jesus. Take note of how the various people in this passage respond to the news of Jesus' birth. How did these respond?

## **EXPERIENTIAL ACTIVITY – Stargazing**

Pick a dark, clear night and go out to do some stargazing. As you look up at the many beautiful stars, consider these questions. (If doing this activity in a group, discuss them together!)

- 1) What might have it been like for the wise men, following a star to a prophesied King?
- 2) Note how even what looks like a small flicker of light is able to pierce the darkness! Just as the Bethlehem star announced the inbreaking light of Christ's glorious kingdom in our world, we too sometimes experience flickers (or even bright flashes!) of the light of God's kingdom. How have you experienced the light of Jesus casting out the darkness in your world recently?
- 3) Scripture tells us that Jesus is "the light of the world" (John 8:12) and "the bright morning star." (Revelation 22:16) As you gaze at the beautiful stars above, what do you think these verses mean? Does actually looking at the stars in all of their brilliance give new life to these familiar passages?
